Pomerania – in other words maritime region

What is pomerania?

- Historical land in Polish and Germany, at the mouth of the Reknica, Oder and Vistula rivers to the Baltic Sea. The name of the region derives from the geographical location of the region, "land lying by the sea, that is, near the sea"



What can you see?

- If you think that the Pomeranian Voivodeship is only beaches and no other attractions, you are very mistaken. It is a magical region, full of monuments, culture, art and interesting places, definitely worth seeing.



Słowiński National Park – traffic dunes

- This park, which has a silvery seagull as its symbol, covers the entire Łebska Spit and several lakes: Łebsko, Gardno, Dołgie Wielkie and Dołgie Małe. The most characteristic elements of the landscape include coastal lakes, peat bogs, picturesque forests and forests and, above all, moving dunes appearing in the spit belt. It is an ideal place to relax and commune with nature, unprocessed by human hands.



Tricity – a triple dose of attractions

Lovers of monuments and urban life who want to go to the Pomeranian Voivodeship must definitely visit the Tri-City. The resort consists of three neighboring cities: Gdańsk, Gdynia and Sopot. It hides many different attractions and monuments from different periods.

Malbork – a castle with a centuries-old history

For centuries Malbork was the seat of the Teutonic Order. It dates from the thirteenth century and in terms of area is considered the largest castle in the world. It has been inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List. The Gothic complex consists of three parts: the Upper, Middle and Low Castle.

Symbark – House on the head

- The Italians have their Leaning Tower in Pisa, and we have an upside down house in Symbark. Not far from this small town, among the trees, an interesting attraction has been built, which can make you feel more dizzy. You enter the interior through the gable window, and inside you walk on the ceiling. If you want to practice balance, here you will have a great opportunity to do so.





- ***Sightseeing curiosities***

- The center of the Pomeranian Voivodeship is the town of Nowa Wieś located near Kościerzyna. The Kashubian Sea includes five interconnected lakes: Wdzydze, Radolne, Gołuń, Jelenie and Słupinko.
- Sopot pier is the longest wooden pier in Europe.
- Dunes from the area of the Łebska Spit and the Słowiński National Park are the largest area of wandering sand in Central Europe
